

"The Faithful God"

Text – Deuteronomy 7:1-11

Introduction: This is a topical message on the thought and subject of "The Faithful God." This is the God of the Holy Bible!

As we read the following texts note this thought. Reading from Deuteronomy 7:1-11; I Corinthians 1:9 & 10:13; I Peter 4:19; and Revelation 3:14.

In a world where every day brings new revelations of chaos and moral confusion, we need to ask ourselves if we really trust God. It's one thing to say, "I trust in the Lord" when the sun is shining and all the bills are paid. It's something else to trust Him when the dark clouds settle round us and the bill collectors are at the door.

The following are three implications of God's faithfulness:

I. Every Word of God is True (Psalm 119:160; Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 24:35).

II. Every Promise God Makes will be Kept (Deuteronomy 7:8-9; I Kings 8:56; II Corinthians 1:20).

III. Every Trial God Allows has a Purpose (Romans 8:28).

Consider these four truths from Scripture:

- A. God knows what I am going through (Job 23:10).
- B. God uses trials to help me grow (Romans 5:3-4).
- C. God calls for me to rejoice in trials (James 1:2-4).
- D. God invites me to submit to His keeping (I Peter 4:19).

Conclusion: Many Christians feel God has disappeared just when they need him most. Take heart, child of God. Just because you can't see him doesn't mean he is not there. Keep holding on to the Lord. He is faithful even when you cannot feel his presence. Hang on, and before you know it you will feel the "tug on the line" that lets you know He is still there. God is faithful!

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
